



CLUB GUIDELINES FOR JUNIOR PLAYERS

Ealing Trailfinders Netball Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all its members. The club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with the club should at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others and respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background or religious beliefs or sexual identity.

Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns they may have about any aspect of the club initially with their coach or the co-ordinating coach, and then with the safeguarding officer or the club chair.

As a member of Ealing Trailfinders Netball Club you are expected to:

- Be punctual at all times for training and competition.
- Inform the coach or team manager if you are going to be late.
- Inform the coach or team manager if you are unable to attend a session.
- Inform your coach or team manager of any injury or medical condition which may affect your performance.
- Ensure you have the appropriate kit for both training and matches.

ENGLAND NETBALL CODE OF CONDUCT FOR JUNIOR PLAYERS

To help you and others in the netball family have fun, feel safe and enjoy netball, you are expected to agree to the following high standards of behaviour.

England Netball's four Sport Ethics are respect, teamwork, achievement and fun.

- NEVER bully, show aggression, or post anything unfriendly or hurtful on social media, chat forums or text
- ENCOURAGE new members and respect that everyone is different
- TELL my Club Safeguarding Officer or an adult I trust about any behaviour or situations I feel worried about
- BE a team player by being loyal, friendly and kind to my teammates and opponents
- ALWAYS play fairly to the rules and show respect to the umpires
- LISTEN to my coach and try and my best at all times
- LET someone in charge know if I leave a netball venue
- RESPECT my team manager, coaches and officials' decisions
- UNDERSTAND that everyone has different strengths and recognise we play better as a team
- LOVE the game
- ENSURE I am on time and that I wear suitable kit for training and matches with my hair tied back,
- short nails and no jewellery
- SHOW great sportsmanship and teamwork, whether I win or lose and always thank everyone involved – the game would not go on without them
